
The rise of the Nationstate: Language, Culture and Identity



Some results of nationstate building

- Competitive relations between countries:
 - The biggest, the strongest, the best...sometimes ending up in conflicts and severe wars (WW1, WW2)
- Stereotyping of citizens: the typical German, Belgian, Dutch...
- Olympic Games and World Championship football, athletics...
- National art and galleries

Demography: Randstad and "Randland": population decline in South Limburg





The Euregion Maas Rijn: a social cultural reality?

Core questions of sociology:

Social structures: do we need eachother to survive, what kind of 'dependences' can be identified?

Cultural:

- EMR: shared perspectives, values, norms in short, a collective consciousness?
- EMR: providing meaning to every day life?
- EMR: frame of reference for behavior and identity?
- EMR: intensive actual interactions –bridging social capital?

Conclusion: EMR is social culturally a *construction, not a society - Er zijn nog altijd grenzen* (v. Beek, 1996)

But: you can make out of a construction a society: see the development of the Nationstate

Scenarios

First scenario:

• Euregion is solution for demographic, economic and social problems of South Limburg – no balance, one-sides, poor marriage

Second scenario:

- More and more intensive economic, social and cultural cooperation make common projects visible and clarify the added value
- Shared (Euregional) investments (f.i. "Kennis-as"-projects
- Euregional e-citizenship/e-residence (see Estonia)
